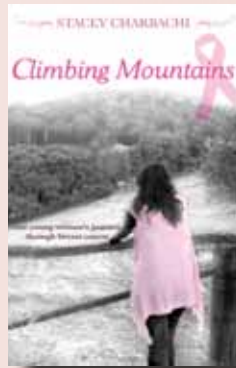


Climbing Mountains
